### **From Pastor Andrew**

Camp was something I was excited for every summer. I accepted Christ at my first camp, and I made friendships that have lasted into my adult life. The weeklong camps when I was in youth radically changed my relationship with God. It is always amazing what a week of focusing on worshiping God and seeking His will for your life will do.

I remember my first camp when I was in youth being so excited. But I was taken aback when I saw a kid from my school was going with us. His name was Jordan, I knew him from school because we had to eat lunch at assigned tables. My class had gotten punished with assigned lunch tables due to fights during lunch and other forms of bulling. No one was happy about the new seating arrangement and this is where I got to know Jordan. I have always been outspoken and an open book about my life, feelings, and faith. Jordan did not like my life, feelings, or faith. He was quick to remind me of this each day at lunch. In short me and Jordan spent most of that school year arguing about everything under the sun. I was not happy to see Jordan in the church parking lot that morning as we loaded the bus for camp. Camp was the one week out of the year I could leave behind all my family drama and worries. Now one of the biggest problems from school was tagging along. Jordan was no happier to be going than I was that he was coming. He did not want to go but a sweet lady from the church paid his way and he was forced to go with two friends of his. That week all three boys were saved, and their lives were drastically changed. It took me sometime to accept what I was seeing. But over the course of that summer I became great friends with these three guysespecially Jordan. We realized our lives were similar in more ways than we would like for each other. We both were caught in the aftermath of young divorced parents with shifty priorities. The hurt we felt as kids and teens was similar in many ways, only I had meet Jesus a little sooner. We connected not only on Jesus and family but had to deal with losing a loved one at a young age. In a short time, we became best friendsno, we became brothers. Jordan is currently pursuing the same degree in ministry as I am. Matt, one of the boys Jordan came to camp with, is currently in training for mission work to unreached people groups. Mitchell, who is Matt's twin that went to camp with us, currently serves in his local church anyway he can and is really on fire for Christ.

I know what change Christ brought in my life, and I have witnessed how he changed the lives of these three friends of mine. *My prayer is that many more teens will have a similarly eye-opening experience at camp this summer.* I am excited to announce that our church youth group will be going to Rehoboth Camp on June 15th-19th to worship and grow closer to God. Laurna -eating out, visiting with family and friends, and of course, playing with their great granddaughter Olivia.


 What have you missed most about not meeting in person for church the last few months?
